Cookies

What are cookies?

A cookie is a small text file on your computer, created by a website to store information about your visit. Once a cookie is saved on your computer, only the website that created the cookie can read it.

How do cookies benefit me?

Some of the cookies are used to remember things you have specifically selected, such as closing or opening the search panel.

Other cookies we use help us understand how people browse humberbridge.co.uk. We use Google Analytics for this. We look at overall trends in browsing behaviour. We collect information such as how many people visit our website, what pages they visit and how long they spend on them, and how long they stay on the site for. Understanding how people browse our site can help us identify areas that we need to improve, or fix problems that are preventing people from finding the information they need.

Are cookies safe?

As you may be aware, most websites use cookies. They won't cause any harm to your device. We do not use cookies to look at individual journeys across the website.
